### SUMMARY

This role is responsible for the creative development, management and strategic growth of ENO Engage's Adult Community programmes and partnerships. Working collaboratively across the organisation, the post-holder will lead the planning and delivery of a portfolio of engagement activity while developing strong relationships with community, cultural, education and local authority partners, freelance artists and other stakeholders to ensure ENO's work is responsive, inclusive and impactful.

The role is responsible for developing and maintaining relationships with stakeholders across London and Greater Manchester, ensuring ENO's engagement work is responsive to local priorities and strengthens connections between communities and ENO's artistic programme.

Over the next year, the portfolio will include leadership of ENO's Community Membership Scheme, Community Partnership Programme and Community Advisory Group, alongside a range of health and wellbeing, access and production-specific engagement initiatives.

The role will also oversee the organisation and ongoing development of the Community Advisory Group, which meets three times a year helping to ensure participant and community voices inform the design, development and evaluation of ENO Engage's work.

Our Adult Community programmes involve working with vulnerable adults across charities and community organisations, therefore a keen interest in supporting and effectively communicating with these groups is essential.

### Key Responsibilities

#### Programme Management

- Leading ENO Engage's adult community engagement portfolio across London and Greater Manchester, developing strategic relationships and identifying opportunities for collaboration, innovation and impact
- Managing relationships with community, health, local authority and cultural partners, ensuring programmes align with ENO Engage's strategic objectives and community needs
- Working with the Director of ENO Engage to develop, monitor and evaluate programme objectives, KPIs and key success measures for the portfolio
- Line managing a Programme Coordinator who will work directly with you on the adult community programme, supporting their development and performance

#### Project Development and Delivery

- Designing and delivering community engagement projects that address external context and participant need, within the strategic context of the ENO's vision, mission and values, balancing the already busy portfolio the role manages with the need for responsive and relevant work
- Embedding participant and community perspectives in programme development and delivery, drawing on insights from the Community Advisory Group and other participant feedback mechanisms.
- Developing project briefs and leads the planning and delivery of projects from conception to evaluation, including timelines, staffing, participant recruitment, resource allocation, documentation and stakeholder engagement
- Collaborating with ENO Technical, Artistic and Production departments to ensure effective planning of support for ENO Engage projects, and understanding timelines across the company
- Managing creative teams; including performers, facilitators, educators and internal ENO staff working on projects, ensuring appropriate timelines are put in place for all stages of the project, giving feedback on plans and delivery to ensure that all work supports learning and creativity
- Leading production-specific engagement activity as required, supporting the delivery of the first Relaxed Performance in the 26/27 season and leading the planning and delivery of the second Relaxed Performance
- Works collaboratively across ENO to improve access and participation for disabled audiences and underrepresented communities

### Key Responsibilities

#### Finance, Contracting and Governance

- Drawing up and managing project budgets as directed, monitoring expenditure, ensuring strict financial control
- Negotiating fees, contracts artists and project personnel, and developing partnership agreements where required
- Ensuring that all projects operate in line with ENO safeguarding, health and safety policies

#### Marketing, Development & Communications

- Working with Communications, Marketing and Development departments to ensure the effective promotion and communication of project activity, and participant impact to partners, funders and wider audiences and stakeholders
- Contributing to website content, internal comms, and reporting
- Developing mailing lists and organising mailings as required, contributing to the maintenance of the department's database of contacts
- Representing ENO Engage at meetings, events, conferences and sector networks as appropriate

#### Team & Department Contribution

The post-holder plays an active role in other aspects of the department's work and undertakes other duties as required, including:

- Contributing to the strategic development of the department
- Contributing to the general administration and management of the department in all aspects of its work, including other projects and in the efficient running of the office
- Supporting management of other Programme Coordinators as needed
- Maintaining awareness of current issues in arts education, community engagement, arts participation and creative health and representing ENO Engage at relevant conferences and networking meetings as required

- Experience managing project budgets and resources effectively

- Experience of working with vulnerable, underrepresented and diverse communities, with a commitment to equity, diversity, inclusion and accessibility in arts and cultural practice
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Knowledge of safeguarding practice and commitment to creating safe, inclusive environments
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively within a small team
- Willingness and ability to travel regularly between London and Greater Manchester

- Experience of line management, supervision or supporting the development of staff, artists or freelancers

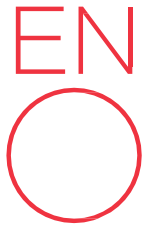

## Backstage Secrets to Success

### Read the job description carefully

The job description is your score and every note counts. This will help you understand whether the role is a good fit and what is required, so you can tailor your application effectively.

### Read the application requirements carefully

Before your first act make sure you know your cues and stage directions. Check for any word limits, additional tasks, or submission deadlines.

### Tailor your cover letter

Your cover letter is your aria- your chance to shine. Use this to tell us things that we can't see on your CV for example: why you want to work with us, how our values align with yours, and any transferable skills that make you a great fit for the role.

### Check your application

Before submitting, review spelling and grammar, ensure attachments are included and correctly named, and double-check that your contact details are accurate and up to date. This is not a rehearsal. We repeat, this is not a rehearsal!

### Prepare for your interview

Research the organisation, be ready to discuss experience mentioned on your CV, and think about questions you'd like to ask us. See the interview as a duet where each voice is equally as important.

### Use AI tools mindfully

AI is a brilliant tool that's transforming how we work however, please ensure your application is honest and a true reflection of your experience. You can use AI to check grammar and spelling, improve structure and formatting, research the organisation or rehearse mock interviews but remember when the curtain rises, we want to see the real you in the spotlight.

### Online interviews

If your interview is online, have a technical rehearsal. Check that the link works beforehand and make sure you have a quiet space, a good internet connection with minimal distractions.

### In-person interviews

Confirm who you'll be meeting on the day, check your route in advance, and leave plenty of time in case of travel disruptions. This is your 5-minute call, you have 5 minutes.

### Accessibility

We are an inclusive employer and want to ensure that our process is as accessible as possible. If you have any access requirements, please let us know as soon as possible by emailing us on [workwithus@eno.org](mailto:workwithus@eno.org) so that we can ensure that the stage is ready for your performance.



### Confidentiality

Confidentiality is so important in this role and our policy is strict. All information concerning staff, patrons and other ENO business, the disclosure of which could be detrimental to the company, must be held in the strictest confidence and may not be divulged to any unauthorised person at any time.

### Data Protection

Data Protection and adherence to GDPR is equally important. We therefore require that computer information should only be accessed if this has been authorised and is necessary as part of the postholder's work. You will need to be aware of the GDPR 8 key principals, and the Computer Misuse Act 1990.

### Health and Safety

Health and Safety is so important at ENO and we would expect that the postholder will be happy to undertake personal responsibility for safety as will be outlined in the ENO safety policy and the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974.
